The difference between live and dead churches

What is the difference between the two different kinds of churches listed above? One of these churches has problems with parking, lack of classrooms, teachers, etc. The other has more work to be done, programs that would work well or mission opportunities that one congregation that is alive might have. Dead ones do not have these kinds of problems, which kind of church do you think we are? If we are alive and are having these kinds of problems then what is the solution? To become a dead church is out of the question (some might like this but it is still not an option). To seek the answer to the problems is the only solution.

Another problem live churches have is that they are filled with weak, neglectful, forgetful and folks who need attention. They are growing and are seeking ways to help these people to grow in the "grace and knowledge of our Lord and Savior." These live churches are concerned, prayerful and giving. Do we have these kinds of problems here, what do you see? Living churches have elders who have a vision for the church as she can be; "a light set on a hill" in this community that is showing the way to the Savior and the pathway to heaven. What do you see here?

Alive churches have members who respond to challenges. The challenge of new programs, new budgets and mission works are ever before alive churches. This preacher would like to issue another challenge. I am not sure of our average attendance on Sunday morning, but I would like us to get to the 100 mark by the end of the year. We have been over this number several times, once at 116 another at 106. So the 100 mark is not out of the question. This number is a challenge but we can do it. So with a little effort we can have this many here. If we all work on this number and always keep it before us, we can do it! Why not begin now to ask ten people to come and be with you for this effort. Send them a special invitation to come and be your guest. Now that means that you need to come too. Alive church also is a church that takes a stand against error and for what is right. Some may not like that, but that is what the church is supposed to be about! Alive churches are also kind, compassionate, gentle, loving, bold, brave, and afraid of nothing.

What do you see here at Monroe? Are we a live church or a dead church? If you suppose that we are dead, then what would it take to make this church alive? Are you going to offer solutions? If one sees a dying man and does not try to help he is guilty of neglect. Remember the parable of the good Samaritan? Within that parable are three men, two were of the Jewish religion. They knew the law and what it required, but they passed by on the other side. So if you think we are dying, then what would it take to resuscitate us?

The problems that we have had are in the past, we cannot change those. We can though live the kind of life that Christ would have us to live. You see we can be the light that is suppose to shine on a hill and it will give light to all that are in the house, but we need to be shinning now, not in the future or in the past, but

"What About your Epitaph?" Have you visited a cemetery and looked upon the headstone of many of those who are buried there. Some read "Asleep in Jesus" others read "At Rest."
